## Snuff Out Candle Fires



Most candle fires start when things that can burn are too close to the candle.

Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on every storey of your home.

Test them every month.



## How do I prevent a candle fire?

- Never leave a burning candle unattended.
   Burning candles can start a fire.
- Consider using battery-operated flameless candles, which can look, smell and feel like real candles.
- When using candles place them in sturdy,
   safe containers that will not burn or tip over.
- Keep candles at least 30 centimetres (12 inches) from anything that can burn.
- Keep children and pets away from burning candles.
- Candles placed on or near tables, altars or shrines must be kept under the supervision of an adult.
- Avoid using candles in bedrooms. Blow out all candles when you leave a room or go to bed.

Use a **flashlight** instead of a candle for **emergency lighting**.
